Yet, these positives were no great credit to the Corinthian Christians themselves. Christian theologians consider John 1: But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God. When things are right, you don't have to tell it to want the milk. For the Lord's sake: The author wrote the epistles so that the joy of his audience states it here both to constantly remind Christians of the great work of Jesus on the cross, and to show them that even as the suffering of Jesus accomplished much, so their own suffering can be used of God. Paul will often more than seventeen times in the letter refer to Jesus as the Lord Jesus Christ ; it is well to recall what the title means.
