The Harpsichord Concerto in D minor, BWV , is a concerto for harpsichord and string . In the first movement the central section is in the keys of D minor and E minor; in the last movement The slow movement, an Adagio in G minor and 3.

It continues throughout the piece providing the foundations over which the solo harpsichord spins a florid and ornamented melodic line in four long episodes.
